### ACTION ALERT! Support SB 900 to Repair Leaking Legacy Oil Wells



As many locals know, the Central Coast was home to one of the largest oil booms in our nation's history beginning in the late 1800s. Back then, once oil wells had reached their useful life, they were often abandoned with slapdash techniques. We have several of these poorly-abandoned "legacy wells" along our coast which leak significant volumes of oil, particularly in the Summerland area. The Becker Well, located in the surf zone on Summerland Beach, is the worst offender.

Fortunately, thanks to advocacy by Channelkeeper, other environmental groups, concerned citizens, and elected officials, the State Lands Commission (SLC) is now investigating the Becker Well and designing a plan to properly re-cap it, and funds for this important work have been included in the State budget. State Senator Hannah-Beth Jackson (D-Santa Barbara) has also championed legislation - Senate Bill 900 - to help monitor and properly cap the 200+ legacy wells along the California coast. SB 900 has passed through the Legislature and is now headed to the Governor's desk. Please click <a href="here">here</a> to email Gov. Brown and urge him to sign SB 900 into law.

# Vote YES ON 67 to Uphold Statewide Plastic Bag Ban on Election Day!



Single-use plastic bags pollute the ocean, harm marine life, and are a major source of unsightly litter that costs taxpayers millions of dollars a year to clean up. That's why 150 California municipalities have banned plastic grocery bags, and why state legislators enacted a statewide plastic bag ban in 2014. However, thanks to big spending by out-of-state

plastic bag manufacturers, there is a referendum to overturn the statewide ban on this November's ballot. That referendum - Proposition 67 - will be the last item on a very long list of initiatives to be decided by voters. Channelkeeper is working with a statewide coalition to rally support for Prop 67.
