training will be held on Saturday, March 25th from 9am-5pm at the USFWS Ventura Field Office at 2493 Portola Rd # B, Ventura.

The BeachCOMBERS program is a collaborative effort between scientific institutions, agencies, and citizen scientists to conduct surveys on local beaches once per month to obtain baseline information on deposition of beachcast birds and mammals. The South Coast Chapter covers beaches between Santa Barbara and Los Angeles Counties. The training will cover BeachCOMBER protocols and bird and marine mammal identification. Rein the Rain with Rain Barrels



Capture some of that free, clean rainwater that's been falling of late in a rain barrel and store it for your future outdoor watering needs. Through our Rein the Rain Project, Channelkeeper is partnering with local vintners and brewers to secure oak barrels previously used to age wine and beer and convert them into rain barrels to help our community conserve water. We have several beautiful, repurposed oak rain barrels available for sale for \$100, which

includes a DIY kit to connect the barrel to your rectangular roof downspout. Rain barrels not only promote water conservation but also reduce stormwater runoff, our number one source of water pollution.
