### Channelkeeper and EDC File Legal Appeal to Protect Against Offshore Fracking



On June 17<sup>th</sup>, Channelkeeper and the **Environmental Defense Center (EDC)** filed an appeal to defend our 2018 legal victory to address the impacts of offshore fracking on the environment and endangered species. A federal court ruled in our favor last November and issued an injunction prohibiting the Trump Administration from approving permits for fracking and acidizing from oil platforms off the California coast until the US Fish and Wildlife Service and California Coastal Commission have reviewed the potential impacts of these practices on wildlife and our coast. The American Petroleum Institute appealed that ruling, so Channelkeeper and EDC have filed our own appeal to ensure full compliance with environmental protection laws.

### Santa Barbara Straw Ban Effective July 1

Last October, at the request of Channelkeeper and the Community Environmental Council (CEC), the Santa Barbara City Council voted to ban plastic straws and stirrers and require that plastic to-go utensils be provided only upon request. The ban (which includes a medical exemption in consideration of the Americans with Disabilities Act) entered into effect yesterday, July 1, 2019! Now that the City of



Santa Barbara has taken this big step to reduce its plastic pollution footprint, we're working on Goleta and Santa Barbara County to follow suit, so please stay tuned for ways you can help the whole South Coast stem the tide of plastic pollution.

Locally, Channelkeeper and CEC have been working to reduce single-use plastic for over a

decade. We first tackled single-use plastic grocery bags by giving away thousands of free reusable bags, successfully advocating for local bag ban ordinances, and supporting the statewide bag ban as well. Channelkeeper and CEC are now championing efforts to reduce the use of Styrofoam and plastic straws, including through local ordinances, our Skip the Straw outreach campaign, innovative pilot projects, and widespread efforts to raise public awareness about the impacts of single-use plastics on wildlife and our oceans.
