ACTION ALERT! Urge State Legislators to vote YES on Plastic Pollution Reduction Act

We all know that plastic pollution is a mounting crisis for our oceans. Let's show the world that California is ready to take action. The California

Plastic Pollution Reduction Act is a response that matches the scale of the issue. It would sets statewide targets to reduce waste from single-use products and packaging, requiring manufacturers to make less of it in the first place and ensuring that the rest can actually be recycled or composted. Recycling in SB – Keep it Clean & Dry

Recycling has changed a great deal over the past year, as China is no longer accepting contaminated recyclables. In California, recycling markets are struggling to find their footing, and many curbside collection programs, like the ones we have here along the South Coast, have changed what materials they are able to accept. So, what can go in the recycle bins? Clean and dry metal (no liquids or food), #1 and #2 plastics (greater than 6"), all paper (but no pizza boxes!), and all glass containers (no food or liquid). All items must be clean, empty, dry, and loose (not bagged). Click here to learn more.



Also, thanks to Ablitt's Fine Cleaner's project to recycle film plastic, you can drop off your clean and dry film plastic (must be stretchy) to be recycled at Ablitt's, Channelkeeper, or CEC. A new pilot project with Heal the Ocean and MarBorg to recycle foam was also just launched, and clean and dry foam can now be dropped off at two MarBorg locations. Click here to learn more.

In the early hours of October 9th, 16 year-old Paige Kieding will dive into the Santa Barbara Channel at Anacapa Island to attempt a solo swim across the Channel to Silver Strand beach in Oxnard - a distance of about 12.4 miles. If she succeeds (and we know she will!), she will be the second youngest open water swimmer to complete this crossing. Paige came to Channelkeeper with the idea of promoting her swim as a fundraiser to support our work to protect and restore the Santa Barbara Channel and its watersheds.
