The Watershed Brigade is a community-based, litter removal program that incentivizes participation through monthly events, social media engagement, and volunteer recognition. The Watershed Brigade Intern will be responsible for implementing core aspects of the program.

Primary Duties:

- Participating in and leading trash cleanups events, which occur on weekends
- Working with SBCK staff to curate monthly Watershed Brigade events
- Identifying trash hotspots for cleanup events and investigating trash hotspots reported by volunteers
- Assisting in the distribution and maintenance of cleanup supplies
